If you have a dice you can turn it into a game. Your child can roll the dice and answer the matching question. We have been learning about the relationship between questions and answers.

The answer to a who question must be a person.

The answer to a what question must be a thing.

The answer to a where question must be a place.

The answer to a when question must be a time.

The answer to a why question must be a reason.

The answer to a how question must be an explanation.
