Our School Day



A school day is a very busy day, there are lots of things that happen! Here is some information on how the day is organised!




9:00 – Our day begins

Parent/carer can bring pupils into the playground via gate 1 Broadlie Drive.

Pupils will play with their friends/buddy until the bell rings. Your buddy will help you to your line and then your teacher will take you to your class.

Breakfast Club, starts at 8:00am and costs ± 2.00 for the oldest pupil then ± 1.00 for additional siblings. Entrance is via the dinner hall at the main entrance of the school.



10:30 - Play Time (15 minutes)

At 10:30am will go out into the playground to play. They should bring a small healthy snack to eat at play time! During play time, they will run around, play with their friends or sit at the tables and chat!

The playground can be a bit scary to begin with, so for the first few days pupils will play with their P7 buddies, this helps them get used to playing in the playground!

CHALLENGE

Encourage your child to-

Practise putting on their shoes.

Practise buttoning/zipping their jacket

Practise opening up packets/peeling fruit, etc.

Make sure they can use the toilet and know about washing their hands.

Practise taking turns at games and sharing with others.

There will be adults to help in the playground, but it is important that pupils can do things on your own now they are a big P1!





12:30 - Lunch Time

Some people like to eat a school lunch and some like to bring a packed lunch, it's really up to you!

Please discuss with your child the choices and place orders before 8am.

We eat lunch in the lunch hall. For the first few weeks, their P7 buddy will help in the lunch hall.

When they have finished their lunch pupils can go out to play!

Practice clearing away their plate from the table after they have eaten. Practice carrying their plate.

Read a book each day.


Talk about their favourite story.

We learn in lots of different ways!








Literacy - Writing

CHALLENGE


Spend time drawing and colouring. Can your child hold their pencil using the correct grip?
